

Wiring the Damper

The damper requires 24VAC power that can be provided by a 40VA, 24VAC transformer. The transformer can be a plug-in type or a transformer mounted on a junction box in the ceiling. A single 40VA transformer can power 10 dampers.

24VAC Connect to 24VAC transformer **24VAC** Connect to 24VAC transformer




Adjustable Close Limit

The R80DWL Damper actuator has a Close position limit that can be used to insure a minimum airflow even when the thermostat tries to fully close the damper. The minimum Close position can be set from about 50% closed to fully closed.

This should be used when a large number of R80DWL dampers are used with the same HVAC system to insure that static pressure does not damage the ducts.

Slide off the cam cover. Loosen the set screw and rotate the close cam counter clockwise to the desired stop position. Tighten the set screw and replace the cam cover.




Setting the Home and Zone Number

The default Home and Zone number for an actuator is Home 1 and Zone 1 and does not need to be changed if no other wireless direct damper controls are used in the same area.

The small pushbutton switch on the actuator is used to set the home and zone number. The home and zone number are also set in the T200WLD or WRCD. Up to 8 different home numbers and up to 8 different zone numbers can be set. The actuators can be set to the Home and Zone numbers before going out in the field. Use the space on the actuator label to record the Home and Zone numbers for easy reference.

SETTING THE HOME NUMBER

Apply 24VAC power to the actuator. Press and hold the switch. The green LED blinks once, then twice, then three times and so on up to 8 times. Release the switch after the number of blinks to correspond to the Home number being set. Enter the Home number on the actuator label for reference.



SETTING THE ZONE NUMBER

After setting the Home number, the Zone number can be set. Press and hold the switch. The green LED blinks once, then twice, then three times and so on up to 8 times. Release the switch after the number of blinks to correspond to the Zone number being set. Enter the Zone number on the actuator label for reference.
